ONE non-clear "privacy bag" per clear, non-coloured bag of residential garbage is permitted. Multiple nonclear bags such as solid colour kitchen catchers or grocery bags will no longer be accepted.

## Three Pugwash and Area Residents Receive the Queen's Diamond Jubilee medal

Each Member of Parliament was designated 30 diamond jubilee medals to present to individuals who have made significant contributions to their communities, province, country, or internationally. Medals were produced to commemorate the 60th anniversary of Queen Elizabeth II's ascension to the throne.

### Multi Purpose Centre

The Multipurpose Community Centre's Action Committee is moving forward and in the planning of the building. The committee has chosen WHWarchitects for the Conceptual Design and Business/Management model.

The chosen site for the Centre is next to the old train station. The committee is looking forward to helping the consultants achieve an accessible, modern design that reinforces the train station aesthetics and character. The project will include restoration and adaptive reuse of the existing train station building. The Multipurpose Community Centre will provide an attractive visual image from the street and when approaching the village from the bridge.

The Multipurpose Centre will provide space for a new library, a much needed meeting room with modern presentation equipment and acoustics, the CAP Site, classes such as Pilates, yoga and non-ball playing sports. It will provide space for the popular Farmers Market and North Cumberland Historical Society.

### WATER SUPPLY INVESTIGATION

Further to the water quality testing work carried out last winter by CBCL Ltd on private wells in the Village, the Municipality of Cumberland have been working on the development of a central water supply for Pugwash. An open house was held on June 19<sup>th</sup> at which time capital and operating costs were presented. The vast majority of those attending the open house were in favour of proceeding with the development of the central water supply.

This fall the Municipality selected Dillon Consulting to carry out a groundwater supply investigation to identify a water source that has sufficient quality and quantity to meet the needs of the Village while being in an area that can be protected from current and future pollution sources. The Municipality is currently in the process of selecting a drilling contractor to carry out this work.

Our work plan is to begin test drilling in January once the ground is frozen. Once a groundwater source has been identified a preliminary design will be carried and application will be made to the Federal /Provincial Infrastructure Program for funding to provide the infrastructure necessary to deliver drinking water to ratepayers in the village . This phase could take 2-3 years to complete.

#### **Emergency Measures Organization**

Do you know where to go if there is a local emergency?

A **COMFORT STATION** is a location set up by church groups or community hall groups that are used by the community as a rallying point for citizens to meet and share information and give very short term comfort. They are not set up as overnight lodging centers. These sites will be managed by the citizens groups that open them. If Cumberland Regional EMO is requesting the services of a Comfort Station, expenses may be looked after by EMO, but only if prior agreements are made.

**EMERGENCY SHELTERS** are sites that are pre-approved by Cumberland Emergency Management and the Canadian Red Cross. These locations have to meet certain standards and Department of Health regulations. The Canadian Red Cross will oversee the operations of the lodging and feeding. These may be short term or long term lodging sites. The costs of operating these shelters will be covered by either Red Cross or Cumberland Regional EMO.

**EMO** identifies these facilities as each emergency occurs, depending on the circumstances of the emergency. Local media and organizations will be informed to let the public know where to go.

Our client numbers have gone up significantly in the last couple of years, particularly among young families. Due to this increase in clients, we have been spending more than we could afford and recently had to lessen the amount of food we give out. We serve approximately 60 families.

The large majority of our clients are from the Pugwash area while the majority of our volunteers are from Wallace and area. We would like to see Pugwash residents volunteer. We are solely a volunteer organization with all funding coming from our local community as well as supplies from the provincial organization: Feed Nova Scotia.
